A reading from the Prophet Jeremiah 23: 1-6

Goodness and kindness shall surely follow me all the days of my life. In the Lord's own house shall I dwell for ever, forever and ever.

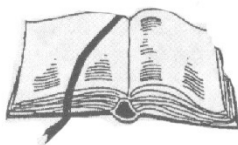
